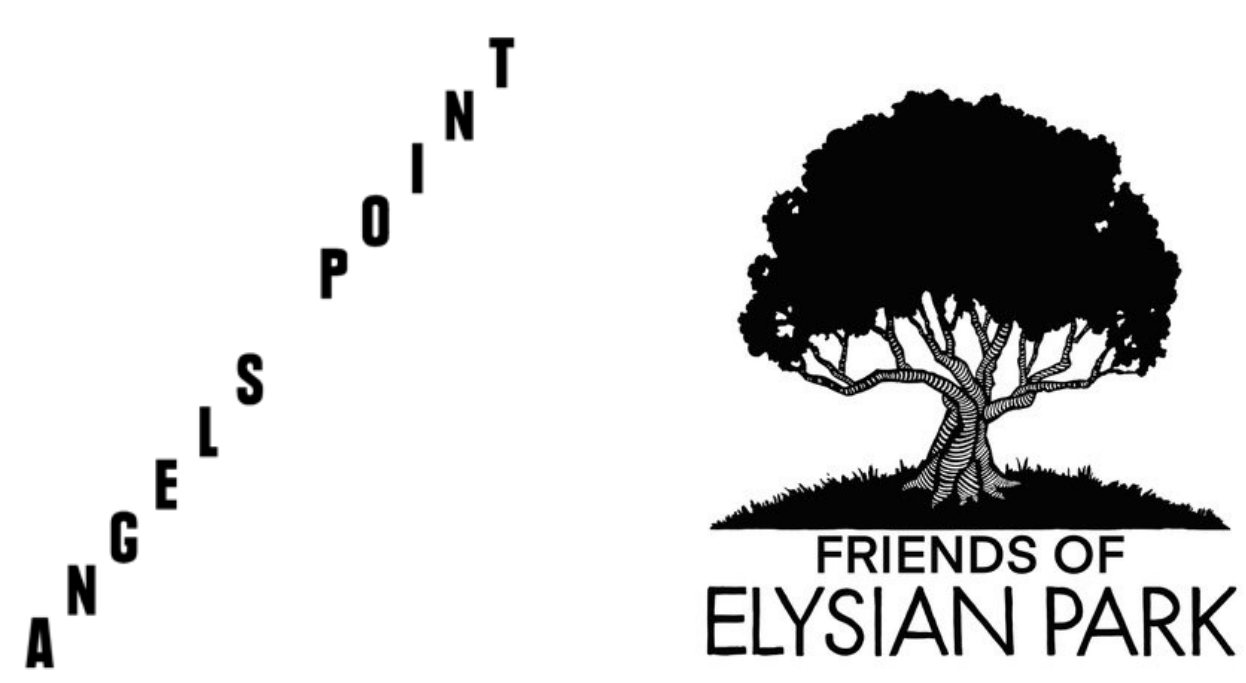
The photographs are scattered throughout the Marian Harlow Memorial Grove, and we invite the viewer to wander off the beaten path to find them.
